What is LACO?

LACO is a non-profit organization, founded in 1985 from the efforts of several area churches. It is sponsored by churches of various denominations located in the Lisbon, Durham and Bowdoin communities.

LACO is administered by an all-volunteer Board of Directors that provides leadership and decision making for the organization. Members of the Board include clergy, parishioners and community members.

Currently churches actively involved in the outreach of LACO include the West Bowdoin Baptist Church, First Congregational Church of Durham, Durham Monthly Meeting of Friends Holy Trinity Catholic Church, Shiloh Chapel, St. Matthew's Episcopal Church, and Lisbon United Methodist Church.

Support and Fund Raising

LACO is supported by the Towns of Bowdoin, Durham, and Lisbon through donations from many individuals, organizations, and churches.

LACO also receives support through matching grants and the assistance of Good Shepherd Food Bank.

Programs

Food Pantry

LACO operates a food pantry located at the Marion T. Morse Community Center. There are no financial qualifications for food assistance, simply proof of residence.

Individuals and families can visit the pantry 12 times per year. Each visit provides a family with a week's supply of food. During 2008, LACO services provided 1302 families a weeks worth of food.

Clothing Pantry

Also located at the Marion T. Morse Community Center is a clothing pantry. LACO welcomes anyone in need of clothing to visit the pantry and take as much or as little as they need.

Heating Assistance

Through this program, heating assistance is provided to those in need with a one time grant. These funds can be used towards heating oil, propane, wood, electricity or any other means in which one heats their residence. A copy of your General Assistance denial will be required.

Hours of Operations

The Food Pantry & Clothing Pantry are open

New hours starting June 2, 2009.

Wednesdays, 6 pm - 8 pm

Thursdays, 8 am - 10 am

and

Saturdays 8 am - 10 am.

(The Clothing Pantry will be closed the second Wednesday of each month.)
